



Emergency Medical Responder Industry Certification – IEMSR001

2020 Information Sheet - Florida

1. The EMR exam is directly aligned with the Emergency Medical Responder Program (8417170 - Emergency Medical Responder and other health science programs - Florida Department of Education Curriculum Frameworks).
2. The EMR exam is directly aligned with the Fire Fighting Program (Florida Department of Education Curriculum Frameworks).
3. Students are eligible to take exam upon completion of the Health Science Core (first 2 courses in health science sequence).
4. Students must be enrolled or have completed a program in Health Science, Fire Fighting or Public Service.
5. Curriculum follows the National Emergency Medical Services Education Standards and Instructional Guidelines.
6. Online Exam consisting of 100 multiple choice questions.
7. The minimum passing score is 70%.
8. The exam fee is \$100 per attempt. Retakes are also \$100 per attempt.
9. Exam can be given up to 3 times. After the third attempt, remediation is required.
10. Study Guide, EMR Instructor Outline, and Pretest are included free of charge to EMR teachers administering the EMR Exam.
11. Recommended Textbook - Jones & Bartlett Learning, *Emergency Medical Responder*, AAOS, 2017, Sixth Edition (ISBN: 978-1-2841-0727-2).
12. On Site Testing Center – Schools and/or Districts complete an application for School/Testing Site Approval in order to test students at the school site, thus saving on transportation costs. A testing site number will be issued upon site approval.
13. The teacher becomes an approved testing administrator; however, a second person must be in the room as the Proctor of the exam. This is mandatory.
14. The Proctor Oath Form must be completed and updated by each proctor and testing administrator prior to testing.
15. Proctors will have their own password to access the testing site and to monitor/approving testing of students.
16. The EMR Certification is on the approved CAPE Funding List – Code Number IEMSR001.
17. This exam may be used by Districts/Schools as the End of Course (EOC) Exam.
18. Helps improve school grade, increases acceleration points, secure funding for academies and programs, and give teachers the opportunity to earn teacher bonuses (\$25 to the teacher for each student passing the exam with no maximum limit).
19. Retakes may be scheduled after 20 calendar days of taking the exam. Students are only allowed to retest after 20 days, as required by CAPE (Test Administration Procedures).
20. Students register online prior to the testing date. An active email account is required to register for the EMR exam.
21. The approved testing site certificate must be displayed in every testing room at the approved location.
22. Testing scores are available upon completion of the exam and a certificate will be generated for printing if a passing score is achieved.
